As you know, our rescued cats are housed in a home-like atmosphere in very spacious indoor rooms equipped with swamp coolers for the summer and heaters in the winter. Our dogs have very spacious, partially covered runs so they can enjoy the sun or the shade. Their runs include a small house to protect their igloos from the elements, water misters and a small wading pool in the summer time. Even though our **dogs have a great life**, we would love to make their time at C.A.R.E. even better, especially on those hot summer and cold winter days in the desert of Southern California. Now that C.A.R.E. is the proud owner of the property where our Sanctuary is located, we can build on the land. We want to build a large building equipped with swamp-coolers and heaters with an indoor and outdoor space for each of our rescued dogs. We have quite a few older doggies and we want them to be cozy, especially in the winters up here when it snows. Please help us make the lives of our rescued dogs more comfortable ones; no amount is too small, everything helps.

After 21 years of C.A.R.E.'s existence and saving thousands of cats and dogs, you would think that there would be less need for a place like C.A.R.E. Unfortunately it seems that the situation with homeless pets is only getting worse! There are so many sad reasons why. Some people are very irresponsible or procrastinate getting their pets spayed/neutered – "Oh, I will get it done any day now, yup, yup! Just soooo busy." and suddenly there are puppies or kittens (cats may have up to 6 or so kittens but dogs often give birth to more than 10!!). Oh boy - and now what to do with all of these puppies and kitties.... Others are back yard breeders whose only reason for having these poor animals is to make money; these people really are as big a part of the problem as "puppy mills". Many people continue to lose their homes and can't figure how to take their fur-folk with them. Some wonderful animals become homeless when their human has passed on and not one of the rest of the family want to honor the departed by taking care of the little survivor – see Brandy's story in this issue. (Please make sure you have something in place to protect your beloved pets for that time when we all must cross the Rainbow Bridge).
